# Yellowstone

#### from the "Daily Environment Report" Bureau of National Affairs

The Interior Department has finalized an interim plan that allows snowmobiles in Yellowstone and Grand Teton National parks for the next three years as it goes about drafting another rule setting emission standards and entrance limits for the machines.

The National Park Service announced Nov. 4 that it would allow 720 snowmobiles per day in Yellowstone and 140 per day in Grand Teton National Park and other areas, beginning in mid-December.

The park service approved a Finding of No Significant Impact for the environmental assessment and interim plan allowing snowmobiles through the winter of 2006-2007. Officials said a final interim rule would be published soon in the Federal Register.

The service published an environmental assessment with a 30day comment period in August.

Yellowstone Superintendent Suzanne Lewis said the temporary plan would allow officials to collect additional air and noise pollution data needed for a new permanent snowmobile plan, the third since 2001.

"This plan will allow the NPS to complete a long-term analysis of the environmental impacts of winter use in the parks. The NPS expects that this long-term analysis will culminate with a permanent decision about winter use in the parks," the park service said Nov. 4.

In recent months, the park service has found itself subject to conflicting court orders on the use of snowmobiles in the parks.

# AWSC Scott Makowski

AWSC had a very successful year as far as getting bills through the legislature during this past session that affects our sport and everyone who enjoys it. First, they supported a bill called the "WILD RIVERS ACT" and got this passed which allows snowmobiles to approach and cross "WILD RIVERS." This allows safer crossings for us by not forcing us to use highway crossings used by cars. Second, we worked to pass a law which requires our youth 11-16 to take a classroom Snowmobile Safety class rather than a CD-Rom class. This allows volunteer instructors the ability to work with the young student at very impressionable age. Students over the age of 16 can use the CD-Rom if they wish to do so. We were also successful in getting the DNR to purchase additional lands to be used for snowmobiling and other motorized recreational uses for the "Rails to Trails" program.

AWSC held its annual workshop at the end of October, offering many "HOW TO" informative sessions affording a great learning opportunity for those in attendance. They had over 800 snowmobilers register for this event plus 98 youth. With numbers like this our sport is strong and growing.

One thing to watch in the future is a two-tier registration, costing those who don't belong to clubs more to register. The extra funds would hopefully go into the trails account to make trails we all ride much better. This is just in the planning stages at this point but could be coming soon.

AWSC convention is coming up on March 18-20 in Wausau, WI and looks like this could be a good time and important one for some in attendance. At this time AWSC holds its election of officers and someone we all know will be running for President.
