

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WCSA Report



This year we lost Dave Schwebe, who was always will to help anyone and everyone. We missed Dave's great stories about the people he was dealing with in his line of work. I'm sure it was Dave who arranged that we had snow this year.

The merchants were very happy to see us and the many other snowmobilers. We had lunch at Bauer's Dam in Conover. The owner was telling us how she was going to the store and buying hamburger buns, one or two packages at a time. Now with snowmobilers coming in the last two weeks she orders nine cartons of buns.

We stayed at the Hiawatha Motor Lodge that was recently purchased by Al and Dawn who are remodeling and updating the whole property. They gave us a special price for the group and did everything they could to accommodate us. I like the Hiawatha because they have large rooms with doors to the common hallway and to the outside from each room so you can get right to your snowmobile. There is also an enormous parking lot.
