





AWSC Director's Notes October 28, 2007

President's Report - The American Council of Snowmobiling Association Access meeting will be held in Madison this Year. It is open to the public, cost is \$75.00 which includes lunch and coffee break. The date is December 1 2007 at Howard Johnson on Washington Avenue. Also the ASCA calendars for 2008 are here at \$20.00 each. We had 25 winners so far this year from Wisconsin. A total of \$1,045 was won by Snowmobilers in Wisconsin. Our contract with Print Com is coming up, the directors voted to continue with Print Com (WSN magazine) for 3 more years. Bill thanked everyone for the cards and well-wishes he received while in the hospital.

Vice-President - reported that at the signing seminar the new Arrow Sign is under discussion, as most do not like the sign. This will be looked at by the DNR and Governor's Council to be improved or replaced. He also stated that he attended a lot of meetings during the summer with the President, or for him while he was in the hospital.

Office Manager - Donna Foesch came back to work in the AWSC office.

Executive Director - get Legislators to club and county meetings. If we get unified, we can get some work done at the Capitol.

Lake States - Raffle tickets come out in December for the Annual Raffle.

COMMITTEE REPORTS,

Snow Show Booth - have been busy going to different shows.

Environmental - Yellowstone Park will be open to 720 sleds per day, will reduce to 540 sleds per day under the new plan. Only top of the line, 4-Stroke sleds will be allowed.

Fund Raising - Silent Auction was a success. Profit of \$2648.00 was made. It was recommended to give out two more \$1,000 scholarships to our youth. There will be only 1500 club-only raffle tickets available, send them in early if your club wants a chance to win some great prizes.

Legislative - 55 m.p.h. was passed in the assembly this past week. It has not come up for a vote in the senate yet. When it's passed, it will be for three more years. We had a roll-call vote on whether we should move forward on the "CAP Program." I spoke to the clubs who were at the workshop, before the vote. Most of the clubs said to go ahead with it. I voted yes. The directors voted, only one county voted no, to not move forward with the program.

Publicity - we have new clothing people for AWSC, information is on the AWSC website.

Safety and Education - People are looking for Safety classes. You must get classes registered on the DNR website. A new lesson plan was introduced. It will help in teaching the class, it is supposed to go along with the manual.

Scholarship - Applications for the scholarship are due January 20, 2008. Applications can be obtained from the AWSC office at 1-800-232-4108 or on the AWSC website.

If Vilas County does not have sufficient snow, the ride will be moved to where there is good rideable snow within 300 driving miles of Milwaukee.

Keep your trails safe, when you are marking them. The state trail maps have been reprinted. The trail committee will state the process of updating for the next printing.

Old Business - the AWSC office will move after the convention next spring, 2008, to its new office in the Madison area.

January 6th and 20th, 2008 February 3rd and 17th, 2008 March 16th, 2008

If a Snobird plans a weekday Snofari for one of the above weeks and everyone is welcome, that ride will be the ride.

If someone plans a weekend Snofari preceding or following one of the above weeks, I thought we would stay at the Snofari's location, ride a few days before or after and yet be able to join the Snofari.

Some of my ideas for weekday rides are:

Start in Waukesha County. Ride west to the Mississippi River, tour the Mississippi River area for a couple of days and ride back to Waukesha County. This ride would be the "Bob Niemi Memorial Ride". Bob and I had been talking about this ride for the past two years but were never able to take it.

Trailer to some location in Central Wisconsin. Stay there and ride in each of four different directions each day.
