Winter was very cruel to our crew, and all of the construction barriers were like debris dams. We used up almost every bag we had.



- Trails DON"T put snow on railroad tracks, when grooming.. It could cause a train to crash. We had a lot of compliments on the trail conditions thru-out the state this last winter. Make sure when grooming the trails, to have ALL EMERGENCY LIGHTS working on the groomers. Trail signs MUST BE UP AND IN PLACE ON TRAILS. Check to make sure signs are where they should be, every time you groom the trails.

Multi-use trails - Keep a close watch on your trails. There are Anti-trail people out there.
