



AWSC Update Scott Makowski

The AWSC Convention was held in Green Bay at the Hyatt Hotel over the March 28-30 weekend. Attending were 767 delegates. They servered 285 at the banquet on Saturday evening.

The biggest news was that the modified Cap/Step bill passed both the House and Senate by large margins. Then it was signed into law by the Governor. Here is the way the law reads:

- ♦ A two-tiered trail pass requirement at an annual cost of \$30 non-member and \$10 club & AWSC member.
- ◆ Provides a free annual trail pass sticker to be displayed on sleds 30 years and older.
- ◆ Increases non-resident trail pass fee from the current \$35/ year to \$50/year.
- ♦ Move to a \$30/3-year registration fee structure.
- ◆ Includes a 4-year sunset clause which requires evaluation prior to renewal of Cap/Step.

This new law will put much-needed funds into the snowmobile trail program allowing us some new trails as well as improving existing trails.

Not everyone will be satisified with this law, however it took much conversation between the Governor's Council, the DNR, and the AWSC to come to a compromise that all parties were somewhat satisfied with. Also the legislators had to be comfortable with the needs of their people back home who elected them.

The AWSC elected the new officers for the upcoming year. All ran unopposed so all were elected. The officers for the 2014-2015 season are:
