



How Will I Get My WI Trail Pass? (Effective July 1, 2015)

- Membership Chairs <u>WILL NOT</u> be responsible for issuing Trail Passes to members. Each member will be responsible for purchasing his/ her own Trail Pass/Passes. Club Membership Chairs will continue to be responsible for current AWSC membership for their members.
- ✓ There will be **4** ways <u>current AWSC members</u> can purchase their discounted Trail Pass after July 1, 2015!
 - Order online through the AWSC website with a credit card (MasterCard, Visa or Discover) using your AWSC member # found on your AWSC membership card or on the address label of your WSN magazine (Sept-March) and your snowmobile registration #.
 - <u>Call</u> the AWSC Office to order your WI Trail Pass with a credit card, your AWSC member # along with your snowmobile registration #.
 - Walk in the AWSC office door and purchase with cash, check or credit card, your AWSC member # and your snowmobile registration #.
 - Mail in your check or credit card information along with your AWSC member # and your snowmobile registration # on the Trail Pass form (still under development) available from AWSC website or your Club Membership Chair.

The DNR has yet to determine the size, shape, color and where to place the Trail Pass on snowmobiles.



The picnic and corn roast are over - thanks to those who helped to put them on. Ideally, especially for the picnic, it would be nice if no one had to work. But short of having it catered, that's not going to happen. I know everyone has a busy schedule these days, especially if you have children with their own schedules, but it would be nice to see more faces at the picnic and corn roast and Christmas party. It's a free benefit, we put on a nice feed, but if you can't you can't.

The Christmas party is in the works - we didn't quite make the minimum for Schwabenhof's last year so we are looking there but also at other locations. Schwabenhof has been quite reasonable in price, so we may go back there even if we have to pay a bit more per plate than if we had a larger group.

Scott is once again running a one-day safety school at the Snow Show at State Fair Park. If you know anyone who needs a certificate here's the way to get it in one day. Otherwise, we will have the three-evening classes in the Falls in December and January.

The club had Board Elections at the corn roast meeting. The three expiring members ran again with no opposition, so nothing changed on the Board. The Board at their meeting elected the club officers. This is the second year for the current slate, and there were no changes there either.

There's a lot of questions and concerns about the whole trail pass change. Keep in mind that it's not for THIS winter, it takes effect next July. There's a summary of the expected process for getting passes in this issue. It may change a bit by July. No matter what, it will cost a bit more in total registration cost than what you are paying now - even more yet if you're not a club/AWSC member.

Congrats to Dave Rowley for being elected to the Groomer Corp Board of Directors, and also taking on the finance committee chair for WCSA.

SAFETY SCHOOL

The Snobirds will again be offering snowmobile safety classes this winter. The classes are conducted by qualified instructors, from the Snobirds, who are certified by the State D.N.R.. Satisfactory completion of the class meets the D.N.R. requirements.

"Any person who is at least 12 years old AND who is born on or after January 1, 1985 is required to possess *a valid Snowmobile Safety Certificate* in order to operate a snowmobile on public trails, lands or frozen waters. You must carry the certificate while riding and you must display it to a law enforcement officer when requested."

As this training is important to public and personal safety, a parent or guardian is welcome to attend with their student without paying a fee, unless they also wish to be certified. There is a \$10 fee for registration and D.N.R. safety materials. The course consists of three evening classes with subjects of snowmobile laws, ethics, terminology, maintenance, clothing, first aid, environmental and ecology problems.

We have two sets of indoor sessions scheduled this season. Total cost is \$10.00

The first set will be December 3, 10 and 17 at the Menomonee Falls Community Center, W152 N8645 Margaret Rd in Menomonee Falls.

The second set of classes will be on January 7, 14 and 21.

For reservations call Gary Breuckman at 414-442-4279. Classes run from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. each night, and you must attend all three sessions to be certified.

One Day Safety Class

To be held at the Milwaukee Snow Show October 18, 2014







SnoBirds will put on a 1 day snowmobile safety class in conjunction with the Milwaukee Snow Show. Last year we had 72 students who attended and passed the DNR test allowing them to ride by themselves this winter. This is a 9 hour, all day class conducted by mostly SnoBird instructors. It covers all the basics of snowmobile safety procedures and is required by all riders born after December 1, 1985. Those under the age of 16 are required (classroom) to take a hands on safety class while those older individuals can go on line with the DNR website and take the class there.
