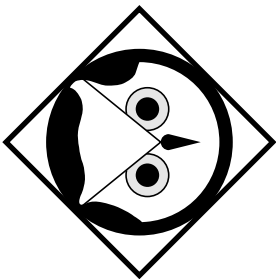

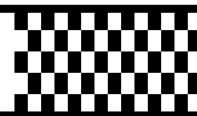

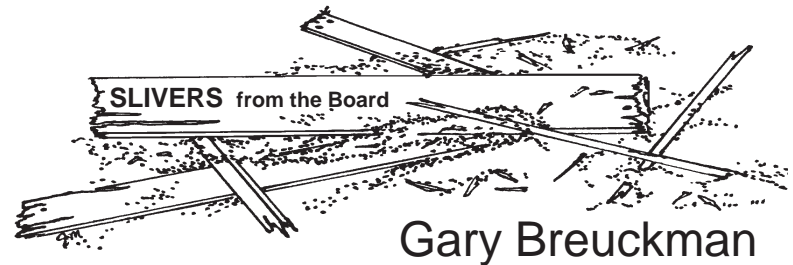

We've had a busy summer, with campouts, adopt-a-highway, picnic, and last but not least the corn roast and elections.

SAFETY SCHOOL

The Snobirds will again be offering snowmobile safety classes this winter. The classes are conducted by qualified instructors, from the Snobirds, who are certified by the State D.N.R.. Satisfactory completion of the class meets the D.N.R. requirements.

“Any person who is at least 12 years old AND who is born on or after January 1, 1985 is required to possess a *valid Snowmobile Safety Certificate* in order to operate a snowmobile on public trails, lands or frozen waters. You must carry the certificate while riding and you must display it to a law enforcement officer when requested.”

As this training is important to public and personal safety, a parent or guardian is welcome to attend with their student without paying a fee, unless they also wish to be certified. There is a \$10 fee for registration and D.N.R. safety materials. The course consists of three evening classes with subjects of snowmobile laws, ethics, terminology, maintenance, clothing, first aid, environmental and ecology problems.

We have a special one-day class held at the Milwaukee Snow Show, and then two regular 3-night sets of classes in December and January. The one-day class is on October 17th from 10am to 6pm, for information or to sign up call Scott Makowski at 262-252-3496.

The 3-night class sets are on December 2, 9 and 16 and the second set on January 6, 13, and 20, all at the Menomonee Falls Community Center, W152 N8645 Margaret Rd. The classes run from 6:30 to 9:30 each night, and you must attend all three classes of the set to be certified. For information or to sign up call Gary Breuckman at 414-442-4279.
