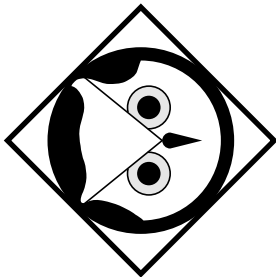

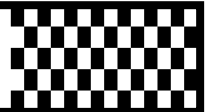

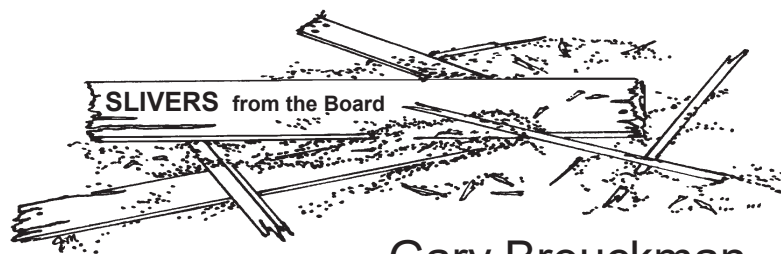
Eagle River Snofari report.
